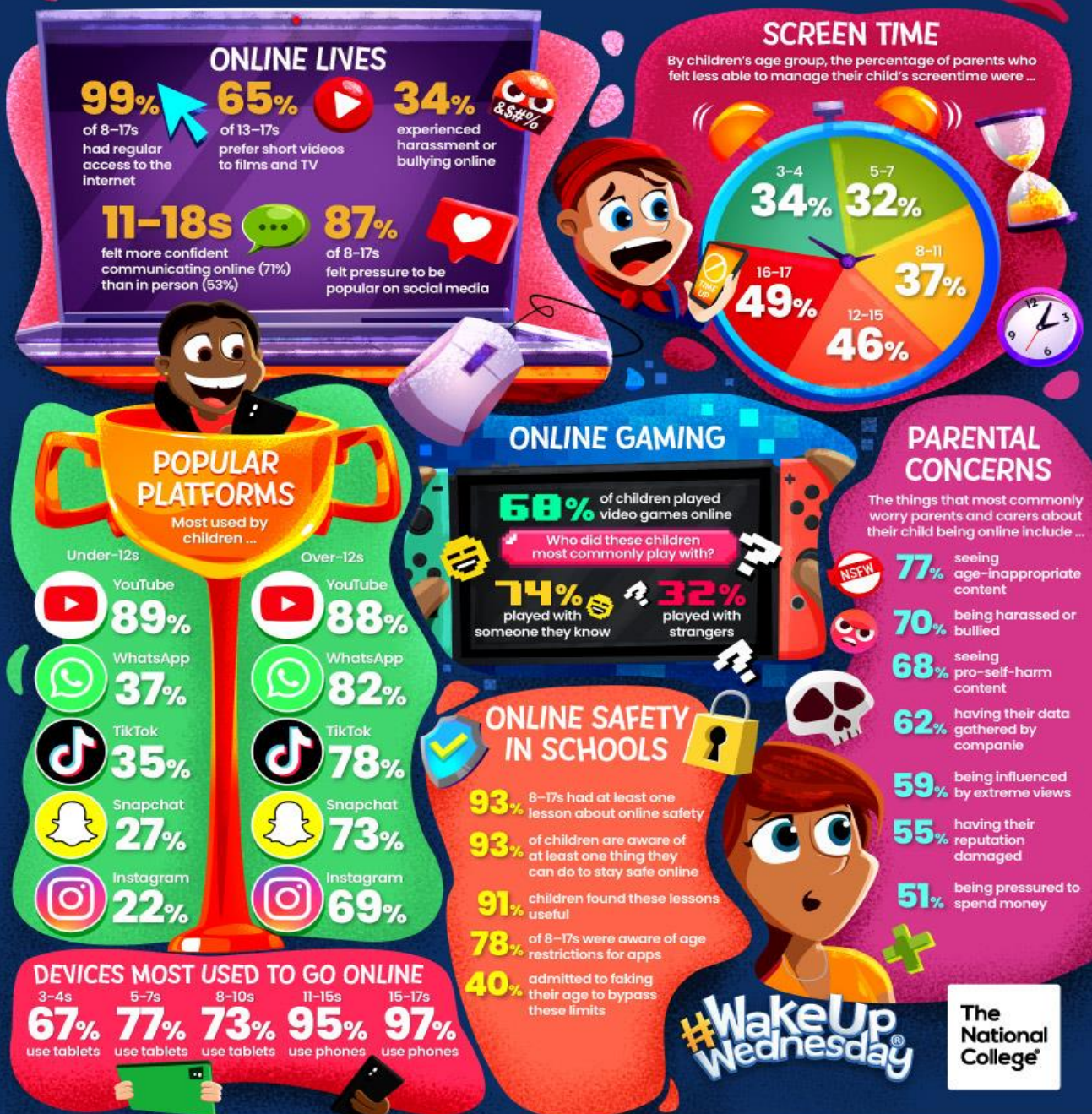
After School Clubs (Reception, Year 1 and Year 2)
